



A generous gift to the International Maritime Museum in Hamburg


In former times, the bone ship model of the French ship of the line JUPITER was placed in the meeting room of the Hamburg Süd company in Hamburg. JUPITER was a *Téméraire* class 74-gun ship of the line of the French Navy.


It would appear that the Bone Ship Model has undergone major restoration, especially the rigging, and the guns look quite new. The model originates from 1795-1812. It measures 55cm (length), 48cm (height), 17cm (width, main yard).











The armament¹ of the ship was: Lower gundeck 28 x 36-pounder long guns, upper gundeck 30 x 18-pounder long guns, on the Forecastle and Quarter deck 16 x 8-pounder long guns, 4 x 36-pounder carronades.

This bone ship model carries: Lower gundeck 28 x 36-pounder long guns, upper gundeck 30 x 18-pounder long guns, on the Forecastle and Quarter deck 22 x 8-pounder long guns, and 2 guns in the gunports of the counter.
